

How your children learn

Let's yarn about learning

Does your child:

- not always respond to their name?
- not always understand what you have said?
- sometimes forget what you have asked them to do?
- focus on the small details?
- find school work hard?

If you answered yes, this may mean your child:

- isn't sure what they need to do
- is mucking up at school or doesn't want to go
- has difficulty maintaining attention
- does not understand the bigger picture
- need lots of help to learn new things

If your child behaves like this, you could try:

- visuals – pictures or words on cards that help to explain these ideas
- getting their attention before you talk to them
- focusing on their strengths or interest areas
- teaching them one step at a time
- giving positive feedback when they do the right thing
