The program is designed to support whole school, sustainable change.

It provides practical ways to strengthen partnerships between families and school staff and promote improved learning outcomes for students on the autism spectrum.

This free program provides a combination of face to face learning experiences and online learning activities, leading to the implementation of a school action plan.

A small funding allocation is available to support schools' participation in the program.

Participants will:

- Explore current evidence informed research and information about autism and better understand the impact on a young person's learning and participation
- Reflect on the experiences of young people on the autism spectrum and their family members
- Investigate the processes and strategies that strengthen effective whole school change
- Plan and implement strategies that support the young person to maximise learning in the school and home environment



Program Steps:

01

- Meet with a Positive Partnerships staff member to confirm involvement and discuss expectations and commitment
- Form a school Action Team to co-ordinate the program and lead change within the school
- Whole staff complete two online learning modules
- Whole staff complete a survey to identify school strengths and priority areas

02

• Action Team participate in a planning day to review the survey data. Work with Positive Partnerships staff to plan content delivery of 2-day whole staff professional learning

03

- Whole staff participate in two face to face workshop days
- Action Team supports colleagues' learning at the workshop and the development of action plans based on survey data

04

- Post workshop days, whole staff complete two online learning activities
- Whole staff participate in the implementation of school action plans

05

- Action Team continues to support their colleagues to implement plans
- These plans should include activities that support family engagement with the school's priority areas

06

- Whole staff complete a follow up survey
- Action Team coordinate staff to submit their review and reflect on the implementation of action plans
